We, the Montfortians are at the threshold of our General Chapter which is time of grace and discernment in terms of our charism and spirituality. and charism of our founder and enable ourselves towards the message of hope and peace. As the theme of the chapter enlightens us saying "dare to take risk for God and for humanity" our sense of creative fidelity to our consecration and mission in a more vibrant manner. Mary our Blessed Mother took a risk and brought forth the saviour, the mystery of Incarnation becomes the central mystery of our Christian faith. We are called to imitate Mary and do the will of God in fulfilling our vocation to sanctity and holiness. In his message for Easter 2022 Pope Francis greets the faithful saying, Jesus is Crucified One, is risen! He stands in the midst of those who mourned him, locked behind closed doors and full of fear and anguish. He comes to them and says: "peace be with you!" (Jn 20:19). He shows the wounds in his hands and feet, and the wound in his side. He is no ghost; it is truly Jesus, the same Jesus who died on the cross and was laid in the tomb. Before the incredulous eyes of the disciples, he repeats: "Peace be with you!"

Yes, amidst wars, political unrests, communal disharmony, ecological imbalances due to man disasters, conflicts and tensions take away peace, social harmony and sustainability at different ways. Peace is the need of the hour world over. So Easter has the message of peace as it comes faster to soothe the thirst and hunger for peace, harmony and tranquillity. The Holy Father Pope Francis offers ways and means to overcome conflicts and live amicably. For this he promotes "a culture of encounter and journeying together in Spirit." "Creating, developing and sharing the culture of encounter and journeying together involve the individuals and communities to encounter God and one another in experience of life. It is being a genuine experience of fraternity, a caravan of solidarity, a sacred pilgrimage" (*Evangeli Gaudium* 87). A true Christian encounters with an event, a person which gives a new horizon and a decisive direction. Life, for all its contradiction, is the art of encounter (*Fratelli Tutti*. 215). Our service in mission is an action where we meet people and share with them the message of peace and solidarity and call for fraternal life as the way to eternal life. We, as Montfortians are called to encounter communities and charism in the light of faith we have received from our founder. Whenever we encounter another person in love, we learn something new about God (EG 272).

The Holy Spirit tells us that wisdom is not found in the hearts of those who live in comfort (Job 28:13), gratifying their passions and bodily desires, because 'they who are of the flesh cannot please God' and wisdom of the flesh is the enemy of God (Rom8:8), says St. Louis de Montfort (LEW 194). We must practice, self-denial and renounce the world and self. Very often our journey to God is hindered by our unhealthy attachments, held back by the seductive snares of our sins, by the false security of money and appearances by the paralysis of our discontents, in order to walk, one must unmask these illusions. Donald Neale Walsh, in his book, "Communion with God", tells us that we are led by illusions and falsities of life events. He speaks of ten illusions and one of them is, needs exists, so I go on increasing my needs, but he says, "you came without anything and go without anything, why do you need?" We have made cultural story, so one need we attach many more ... It is a time to reconsider the roads we are taking, to find the way back home, to rediscover the fundamental bond with God and one another. The Father who calls us to return is the one who leaves the house and come looking for us, (Lk 11). The Lord who heals us is the One who let himself be wounded on the cross.

As Montfort tells us, in Friends of the Cross, "Now is the time to suffer and mourn, to pray and to do penance, to live in retirement and poverty, to humble and mortify ourselves, for those who do not possess the spirit of Christ, which is the spirit of the cross, do not belong to Him. Those who belong to Christ have crucified all self-indulgent passions and desires. We must be true images of Christ (FC 9)". This is the message of hope for Montfortians! Have confidence, they say to each other. If God is on our side, within us, and before us, who can be against us? Let us reflect, share the goodness, greatness and magnanimity of our call to commit ourselves to the cross, poor and Wisdom incarnate.

We celebrate the Golden Jubilee of our presence in this land of ours, vibrant with religious faiths, spiritualities, cultures and ethnic groups. There are many challenges to overcome and make our home to the abode of the Father above. What are our aspirations? Do we inspire people? It is time to look back and give thanks to God for the wonderful way he has accompanied us as Montfortians and praise God in manifold ways, so also seek graces and blessings to move forward with hope and united in company in fraternity in the words of Pope Francis. Let us be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit andwhisper the prayer of St. Louis Marie de Montfort " Liberos: free men. Men always available, always ready to obey you when those in authority speak. Always with words of Samuel on their lips: praesto sum, here I am, always ready to be on the move and to suffer with you and for you, just as the apostles were: *eamusetmoriamur cum illo*, let us go and die along with him"(PM 10). May the forth coming events in our congregation that is our General Chapter and the Golden Jubilee our presence lead us to begin a new chapter in our Vice Province and the accompaniment of the Risen Lord open our eyes and hearts and burn with the zeal for the greater glory of God.

350THBIRTHANNIVERSARY OF

ST. LOUIS MARIE DE MONTFORT

St. Louis Marie de Montfort was born on 31st January 1673 in Brittan in the town called Montfort- la-Cane. From his



childhood day onwards, he was a virtuous and exhibited an extraordinary love for Blessed Virgin Mary and for the poor. He became a priest and worked ceaselessly for God Alone. On Jan 31st we celebrated 350th year of our founder's birth anniversary all over the globe by the three Congregations namelv Montfort Fathers. Montfort Brothers of St Gabriel, Daughters of Wisdom and by the Montfortian lay associates. His birth is something special for the Montfortian family. If one visits Rome in St. Peter's Basilica would see the Statute of St. Montfort. Montfort was conferred with the title as 'Apostolic Missionary' by Pope Clement the XI in the year 1706. He was beatified in the year 1888 and Canonized as Saint July 20th 1947 by Pope Pius XII. He was a great missionary of extraordinary range and influence who worked in 12-14 dioceses in France and preached more than 200 missions. According to biographer Joseph

Grandet, Montfort added the name Mary into to his name on the day of his confirmation; it is because of his love for Mother Mary. In True Devotion to Mary no.63, St. Montfort says "It would be easier to separate light from the Sun and heat from the fire but it is not easy to separate Jesus from Mary."

350th birth anniversary is also a unique one for us because the dark time of Covid-19 is almost disappearing and we are freed from this pandemic to rejuvenate our spirit. In fact, this year Jan 31st I had the opportunity to attend the birthday celebration of St. Montfort in Montfort Nivas community, the feast was solemnized bv Rev Fr. Peter Mascarenhas our Provincial Superior. As we mark our founder's birth anniversary, I wish that this celebration will increase our hope, and help us to rise above the challenges, failures, indifferences and aggressiveness. In our spiritual journey like our founder let us glorify God and live for God Alone. God Alone was the motto of St. Montfort and repeated this motto over 150 times in his writings. He sang "God alone is my tenderness, God alone is my support, and God alone is my every good, my life and my wealth" (Canticle 55: 11). His love for God was total. It was with God and for God that

he went towards other people and walked the roads of the mission."

Today what our Holy Father Pope Francis asks the world catholic leaders through the Synod 2021- 2023 is to go to the people, to encounter, to listen, and to get them involved. St. Montfort himself walked, talked to the people and gave religious instructions to them without and colour, cast discrimination. Communion, participation and mission were the characteristics of his heart. Let us draw the inspiration from him and in our mission let us keep the legacy and charism of our founder alive. Let us Rise and Shine.

ST. JOSEPH'S HOSPICE, DINDIGUL

The word "HOSPICES" is derived from the Latin word "HOSPES". St. Joseph's Hospice was started in 2005. It is a home providing life to the dying destitute through dedicated and dignified treatment during their last stages of life. It was begun with the concept to give a dignified last rites rather than dying in the streets. St. Joseph's Hospice is run by LIGHT FOR THE BLIND INDIA TRUST, having its office situated in Sirunayakkanpatti Village, A Vellodu Via, Dindigul Dist. The Chief Executive Officer of the Trust is Rev. Fr. R.V. Thomas. The hospice was founded by Fr. R.V. Thomas along with two Jesuit Priests Fr.Mathai SJ, Fr. R. Geroge SJ and Mrs. Myrtle Watkins from UK. Fr. Thomas

and Mrs. Myrtle Watkins, his benefactress went to Madurai Aravinda Hospital. While returning back they found a man in a broken cemented dust bin in front of a hotel, along with few stray dogs, pigs and a cow competing for some left overs. He was deaf and dumb with only one foot and a gangrene eaten hand. He became the logo – a symbol and representative for thousands of such "least of my brothers and sisters" who are looked after with care, love and human dignity, until their very end.

Now the mission has spread into five hospices situated in different parts of Tamil Nadu. The biggest one is in Paleswaram village in Kanchipuram District having capacity for 500 beds. The other one is situated in Pulichapallam village, near Pondicherry, with 250 beds. There is a collection center in Tambaram in the outskirts of Chennai. Now another new one is being planned in Avadi, Chennai.

At present about eight hundred patients are being cared for in all the hospices. It reminds me of our Founder Father de Montfort's mission in public hospital and his carrying the poor man at Dinan and proclaiming the famous statement "Open the Door to Jesus Christ". This is truly a Montfortian mission to carry forward. May St. Louis Marie de Montfort and Blessed Marie Louis inspire us to launch into this mission.
